were many challenges to overcome, this team rose to the occasion to make it happen.

Marilyn oversaw the interior and exterior teams in charge of designers and was the homeowner liaison. This was no small task! Thank you for keeping the train on track.

Garrett was not only the ticket guru but also the mastermind behind the very successful marketing efforts that made Showcase such a success. More than two million impressions were shared on social media and 100 banners were installed throughout Pasadena. He greatly expanded digital advertising, orchestrated numerous sales promotions, and increased print advertising. Incredible!

Matt was the behind-the-scenes person extraordinaire! Whether it was pulling off the miracle to get the house ready for Designer Walk Thru, managing iffy internet, building out shops and the restaurant, securing auxiliary power, making sure the house shined every morning while we were open - well the list goes on and on. Thank you, Matt.

Lynn took on Shops. With only 19 vendors, we sold almost \$2 million in goods - the highest since 2011! Lynn provided the benefit leadership team with excellent analytics and made the wine flow with generous donations from San Antonio Winery. Cheers!

Marybeth was in charge of benefit hospitality, restaurant, special events, and PARTIES. The Empty House Party was the hit of the season as reported by all the major news outlets! Premiere Night raised almost \$100,000 and the restaurant grossed more than \$150,000. This was quite the achievement as she had to find a replacement restaurant caterer only two weeks before we opened. The Sunday brunches, Friday night themed dinners, and musical performances rounded out our extraordinary venue!

Vikki, in her own quiet way, was the glue that held us all together. Not only did she take on many of the designer liaison duties, but she was also in charge of the staffing, transportation/parking, and program teams, and she managed all permits and other requirements mandated by the City of South Pasadena. She tirelessly managed the day-to-day operations and was always available to support each Benefit Leader when needed. My heartfelt thanks!

Once again, I thank this team for their extraordinary talents and dedication.

Last but certainly not least, I want to thank **Crescendo for Music and the Arts** for its generous contribution of \$368,000 that enabled us to make \$500,000 in donations as part of our Gifts and Grants program. Thank you **Fran Biles** for your leadership and your long-standing support of PSHA.

## 1st Vice President

The Policies and Procedures Committee reviewed and updated many Showcase policies this year. You might think that the most significant one was the change that Matt referred to at the June meeting to eliminate the dollar figure enshrined in the bylaws concerning the cost for Hollywood Boxes. Maybe so, but there was another change to our policies this year that will impact a few more of our members. That was the implementation of the recommendation of the Organizational Advancement Committee regarding membership service requirements. Members joining Showcase in 2022 will have fewer staffing requirements each year, but more years of Active or Business membership to become eligible to be an Associate member.

These changes also affect current members in a couple of ways. First, Active members who have completed one to five years of service will continue with the existing membership service requirements, that being that after six years of membership, an Active member is eligible for Associate membership. Current Business members' eligibility for Associate membership also will not change. The number of shifts required each year for both Active and Business members also is unchanged. However, what will change is that those shifts can be during pre-staffing, or while Showcase is open to the public, or any combination that the member chooses. The requirement that a member do a specific number of pre-staffing shifts is

eliminated. Current Active members are required to do 12 total staffings; Business members are required to do 7 total staffings.

The second change pertains to current members that have completed the years of service to be eligible for Associate status, whether now Active, Business or Associate. If that member elects to be either an Active or Business member, the member will have the new service requirements. That means that existing Active members who have more than 6 years of membership (or Business members with the applicable years of service) will have the new staffing requirements. Also, an Associate that returns to Active or Business membership will have the new staffing requirements. The new staffing requirements are: ten shifts for Active members and six shifts for Business members.

This year's 35th Annual Instrumental Competition held at the Pasadena Conservatory of Music was the first time that high school-age students from 14 to 19 were chosen to compete. In 2020/21 the competition was paused for one year due to the pandemic which gave us time to explore all the recommendations to revise and update the past program. As a result, it was unanimously decided to "give back" to the communities that support Showcase House and offer the competition to local high schools.

There were six judges, headed by Evan Kuhlmann. An interesting fact shared by Kathryn Hofgaarden was that one of the judges, Michelle Tseng, who was our violin judge this year, received our "Most Promising" prize at our 25th competition when she was 19 years old. Now she is a member of the LA Phil. The other judges included Dahae Kim, Cello, Burt Hara, Clarinet, Tianyun Jia, Violin, and Jeffrey Strong, Trumpet.

The judges were highly supportive of the change to high school students as the talent was there and the students' performances proved that. A total of \$18,500 in prize monies were awarded from the proceeds of PSHA's annual benefit.
